

VERAPAZ STATISTICS

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The Alta Verapaz of Guatemala is unique in Mesoamerica because of the lack of a violent hispanic conquest and subsequent encomendero exploitation (cf. Saint-Lu, 1968). The absence of such a conquest allows it to be used as a model against which one can test other theories of population decline and change in the Colonial period. The purpose of this paper is to provide data allowing those who wish to prepare these type of models using the Kekchi (Coban, Carcha, Chamelco, Lanquin, Cahabon), Pokom (Cahcoh, Cabasion, Tactic, Tamahu, Tucuru) and Choloid Maya communities of this area. It is based on, mostly, unpublished documents recently discovered by the author in the Archivo General de Indias, Seville, Spain and elsewhere (cf. Table 1).

Table 2, List of Tributarios, except for 1768 (which is a count of families), represents the tax paying (tributario) portion of the population. Numbers in italics represent either estimates, based upon the lowest and closest in time figure, or readings made from damaged documents. Although given in the original document as "1597", entries for this year are being read as if they were "1579" which it is felt makes better sense upon comparison with data from other years. The document itself (AGI Guatemala 172) is a sixteenth century summary based upon other documents and not the original census manuscript. Another reason for doubting its accuracy is a different (and more reasonable total for the Verapaz in the year 1597 of 2,150 tributarios than that arrived at by adding what is here assumed to be really a "1579" list. In 1564 the total for Coban includes 100 tributarios; in 1566, 200 tributarios, and in 1571, 120 tributarios, all of whom are identified as being from the Chol

community of Acala. For data on the persistance of a Chol speaking enclave at Coban, and Chol surnames, into the nineteenth century one should see the articles of Escobar (1841) and Feldman (1978).

Table 3 provides a breakdown of the total Verapaz adult population in 1566. Column 1 is the total number of "vecinos" per town. Column 2 provides the number of those who serve the caciques and principales, column 3 those who serve the Catholic church, column 4 the number of those who serve the crown ("tributarios"); column 5 is made up of those exempted from paying tribute because of age or health and Column 6 is of those exempted from tribute because they were only recently brought under Spanish Control (these last are all from Acala). Percentages of total adult population are given in the bottom row for each category.

Tabla 4 gives the tribute in different goods owed by the various towns in the first two decades of these payments (payments began in 1560). It is interesting to note that often the number of "gallinas de castilla" paid was equal to the number of tributarios while the number of fanegas of maize was equal to half the number of "gallinas de castilla". As in Table 2, numbers in italics are either estimates based upon the lowest, closest in time, known figure or readings made from damaged documents. All entries for the year 1567 represent, except for Yaxal, amounts given to the caciques and *not* to the Spanish government. In 1564 Tamahu paid one other item, 6 "azumbres de miel", an entry of 3 "cantaros de miel" also appears for 1566 but is not ascribed to any town. Other, separately cited, totals for 1566 include: 1,979 mantas, 15 cargas (= 45 xiquipiles) of pataste, maize and cacao (these last two have an illegible total). It should also be noted that entries for Xocoloc, Yaxal, Canpin and Bolantin are combined under one heading after 1574.

Some word should be said on town nomenclature and disappearance. Out of the seventeen towns given in the 1560's, seven were gone by the end of the century. The inhabitants of Yaxal, Canpin and Bolantin had supposedly "fled into the forests" by 1574 (Viana, Gallego and Cadena, 1955), although their tribute was being paid as late as 1580. San Pablo was extinct by 1580 (cf. Contaduria 968) and the other towns do not appear in the records after 1582. On the other hand, Chamiquin, Purula and Panzos are all communities that first show up in the historic record at or just before Independence (1821) and, in at least the case of Chamiquin, represent a new congregation of recent lowland settlers with the

dispersed remnants of a former settlement (in this case San Andres Polochic (cf. Aguilar *et al.*, 1823). The sixteenth century Santa Cruz Cabasion has been identified with the community known as Santa Cruz Munchu in the eighteenth century (Andonaigue, 1936) and today simply as Santa Cruz Verapaz. One is very tempted, by comparison of tributario totals, to assume (although there is no proof), that San Pablo was merged with San Esteban to form modern Tamahu. Tamahu was known as both San Esteban and San Pablo in the sixteenth century, as was Tactic called both San Miguel and Santa Maria (perhaps also the result of a merger). Finally, inspection of the list of tributarios might lead one to believe that San Geronimo is a synonym for Cabasion, however both appear as separate entries for the same years in the lists of tribute. Nor is there any evidence that San Geronimo is equivalent to the settlement of that name located in Baja Verapaz. Its proper identification, like those former settlements (otherwise unidentified) alluded to in the Viana, Gallego and Cadena (1955) manuscript as now part of the lands of Tucuru, must await further discoveries of appropriate manuscripts.
